**CALL TO ORDER, ESTABLISH QUORUM**

Meeting called to order by Bryan Dilworth at 3:03pm

Commissioners Present: Bryan Dilworth, John Wright

Wright makes a motion to add the ICRMP Invoice to the consent calendar and to amend the agenda to include the letter of support for Project Big Wood, Dilworth seconds and the motion passes.

**ACTION ITEM:** Approve Minutes from February 18, 2026

John Wright moves to approve the minutes Bryan Dilworth seconds. The motion to approve the 2/18/26 minutes passes unanimously.

Wright moves to approve the Consent Calendar with the addition, Dilworth seconds, the Consent calendar is approved.

**NEW BUSINESS (ACTION ITEM):**

**-Star Bridge Walkthrough**

There was discussion around opening the levee near the north end so water could flow into the old floodplain to the east. The impacted land would be agricultural but FCD9 would need to work with the landowner in order to explore that option. It was also brought up that FCD9 could abandon the levee since it doesn't appear to protect any infrastructure and appears unnecessary. The levee is in good condition, and Dilworth brought up that it may be in the best condition of all of the levees.

There is an area along the levee just past the first river bend, about 125 yards from the bridge, where rock had sloughed into the river. These rocks should be placed back onto the levee before the river carries them downstream. The first half of the levee had very little plant growth and Dilworth pointed out that the trees had been removed around 2018. The back portion of the levee had moderate tree growth along the river side of the levee, most of the trees were small enough that they would not need to be removed. It was suggested that it would be better

to remove the trees before they get larger and that young tree removal should be part of regular maintenance on this (Star) and all the levees.

Other notable areas were the animal trail leading down the side of the levee to the river, and downed trees across the top of the levee.

Bauman brought up using a matrix to help prioritize the levees. Dilworth added that the Army Corps of Engineers uses a matrix in their documentation that also rates risk, and we could use that format.

The Commissioners discussed levees that they currently think may need to be prioritized. First was Broadford Levee followed by Zinc Spur. Zinc Spur has an easement for access and Schoen suggested identifying the access route prior to visiting the levee. Dilworth pointed out that Deer Creek isn't eligible for rehabilitation assistance from the Army Corps of Engineers because of the trees that have grown across the top of the levee.

It was decided that the next levee walkthrough will take place at Bible Camp due to the ease of access this time of year.
